It won't be easy. The Dodgers can pitch.

"It's going to be a good matchup," Chanderdat said. "Their pitching is outstanding and ours has been strong all year -- that's why we led the league (in earned run average). We know we're going to hit a little and if we do, we should be in good shape."

Oshawa's likely Game 1 starter Cam Gray outduelled Barrie's Paul Spoljaric in their first-round opener. Adam Garner, an Oklahoma Baptist teammate of London ace Josh Palmer, centre fielder Christian Ruiz and catcher Mason Reilly, finished the series with an 11-inning effort to bury the Baycats.

"He (Garner) wanted to stay in there and his pitch count was low so we let him go," Oshawa's manager Dan Bleiwas said. "He only threw 106 pitches and then we got the lead so we brought in our closer (Scott Kelly) to finish it in the 12th.

"We can go four deep with our starters and we know London's going to throw good pitching at us with Palmer and (Adam) Echlin. We feel like if our pitching can stop their hitting, we have a chance."

Oshawa, which finished sixth in the nine-team league, has plenty of reasons to feel good. The Dodgers won three of the four regular-season meetings against the pennant-winning Majors and are through to the second round for the first time in the club's seven-year history.

There's a twist in the semifinal schedule. Oshawa will play both Games 4 and 5 at home before the series shifts back to London for No. 6 and 7, if necessary.

"London wanted to play a game on their normal home night of Friday and still have Game 7 at home," Bleiwas said. "We were all right with that because Scott Dart and Roop have been a pleasure to deal with. We have a lot of respect for this Majors team."

If they can wake up their bats -- at the plate instead of against the dugout wall -- they'll be tough to stop.
